## Report to Annual Session 2022

### Pacific Yearly Meeting

#### Overview

It needs to be noted that the reports from MMs were gathered during the time of the Covid-19 pandemic, but as vaccines were becoming widely available in the US. The restrictions we had observed thru most of the previous year were just beginning to ease as this data was collected.

#### Membership Data

We have 23 MMs in CPQM, 9 in SCQM and 3 outside the Quarters. However, it should be noted that one MM in CPQM is in the process of laying themselves down, to become a WG under the care of another MM. Meanwhile, a MM in SCQM has a solitary member who attends a WG outside of their MM, while attenders of that MM carry on the worship there.

Total membership for Pacific Yearly Meeting is 1,149, down a total of 24 from last year. Corrections to last years membership data means that our actual membership last year was 6 less than what was reported (1173, rather than 1179.)

#### CPQM

The membership in CPQM is 751, down 11 from last year. (Corrected data for last year reported this meant CPQM was underreported by one last year). Twelve Friends became convinced this past year, with another 6 who transferred into CPQM Meetings. Ten Friends passed away in College Park, 8 transferred to other Meetings and 11 were released from membership. One Monthly Meeting reports a single junior member, not reflected in the adult totals.

#### SCQM

The membership in SCQM is 298, down 14 from last year. A single Friend was convinced in SCQM this year, and there were no transfers into Meetings, while 7 passed away, 1 transferred out and 7 Friends were released from membership

#### Meetings outside the Quarters

Membership stands at 100 up 1 from last year's corrected count (a Friends passed away in May of 2021, but was not reported until this year). One Friend became convinced, two transferred in and two passed away.

#### Transfers

4 Friends transferred into Pacific Yearly Meeting from other Yearly Meetings, while 4 transferred out. Four of the Friends who transferred within Pac YM were transferring from one CPQM Meeting to another. There were no net changes in our membership numbers from transfers of memberships. Interestingly one particular MM was involved with all 4 transfers within our Yearly Meeting.

#### Interesting Numbers

Our largest Meeting in the Yearly remains Strawberry Creek at 103. Our smallest is Marloma/Long Beach with 1. There are 6 Meetings with less than 10 members; there remain 6 Meetings with 70 or more.

**Where are we concentrated?** Just over 65% of us are in CPQM, 38% of us are in the Bay Area, and 16% in Berkeley alone, with another 6.5% in the Capital District, and 8% around Monterey Bay.

Just over 25% are in SCQM, with almost 17% in the LA basin, almost 7% in San Diego.

Nearly 9% are outside the Quarters, mostly in Hawaii.

The average size of a Meeting is remarkably similar however, averaging 35 in SCQM, 33 in CPQM, and 33 outside the Quarters.
